# **Project experience**

## Stawell River, Cambridge Crossing, Richmond Regional Council (2022)

We undertook a detailed assessment of the proposed new crossing against the relevant Local, State and Federal planning provisions, legislation and regulations to identify the relevant and required approvals and permits required to be obtained, including undertaking cultural heritage and native title assessment and approval strategy.

# Flood Hazard Overlay Code Review & Recommendations, Logan City Council (2018)

Following the 2017 floods, Council wanted to ensure that the Flood Hazard Overlay Code and the associated studies that had informed were fit-for-purpose. This review involved the assessment of the existing models and studies undertaken by several consultants over a 10 year period, providing recommendations on additional works required to ensure that there was consistency in Council's policies and codes, review of the Flood Hazard Overlay Code to identify gaps and provided recommendations on revisions required to be made to protect the cities people, property and infrastructure.

### Local Government Infrastructure Plan (LGIP), Logan City Council (2017)

Working on the stormwater component of the LGIP required the full assessment of the current and future stormwater infrastructure network, undertaking citywide modelling to identify the gaps in the infrastructure, future development impacts, provide solutions to mitigate and adverse impacts, undertake cost analysis of the infrastructure required, preparation of the extrinsic material, completion of LGIP and presentation to Council on the findings and recommendations. This also included developing of a Council wide policy on the assessment required to be undertaken relating to flooding and stormwater management across the city.
